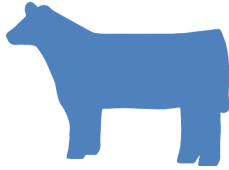

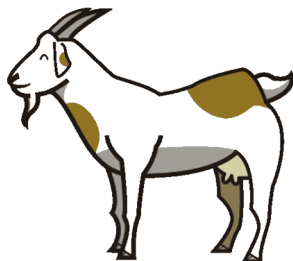

All members who are planning to sell livestock must attend one of these meetings with a parent or guardian.

Attendance of at least one meeting is **MANDATORY!** Failure to attend one of the meetings will result in an additional 10% commission to be added onto the per animal sale charge imposed to sell in the Junior Livestock Sale at Fair. If you attended the sale meeting in February, you have already met your MANDATORY sale meeting requirement.

Additionally this year we are requiring all members who sell livestock to bring in a written thank you and stamped envelope to the extension office **within 30 days of the sale**, before we will release your sale check. When you bring in your thank you, you will receive the plaque/picture frame with you and your animal that you will be expected to deliver to your buyer and thank them in person (the plaque will no longer be given out at fair).

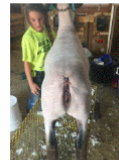

To purchase a pig in this sale, buyers will need to reserve a pig by calling Debbie Fitch at 307-679-2709 and pay \$240 by April 3rd. This will guarantee you a pig. All pigs will be distributed by random draw except the first 10 pigs.

A live auction for the opportunity to choose from the group of pigs will occur for the first 10 selections. The highest bidder will immediately indicate their choice from the group of pigs. This process will be repeated for the remaining nine opportunities to select pigs. After the first ten pigs have been claimed, the remaining pigs will be distributed by the random draw process. The amount the bidder agrees to pay above the deposit (\$240) will need to be paid the day of the sale (check or cash only).

NOTE ~ If you are looking for other 4-H Animals like sheep or goats give us a call and we can share a list of youth producers from Uinta County that may have animals for sale.

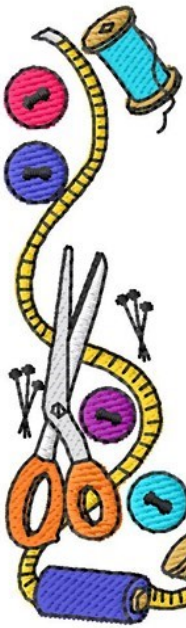

Attention Leaders!!!

2. The face-to-face New Leader Orientation, which is completed by Liz.

A volunteer leader in their **5th YEAR** is required to complete a training that will benefit their role as a 4-H volunteer.

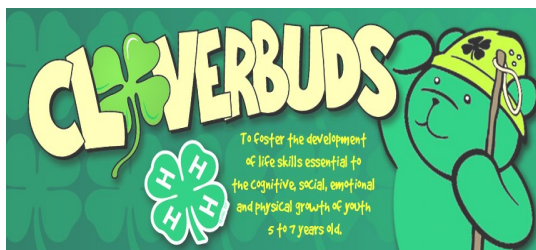
