

If you attended the sale meeting in February, you have already met your MANDATORY sale meeting requirement.

Additionally this year we are requiring all members who sell livestock to bring in a written thank you and stamped envelope to the extension office within 30 days of the sale, before we will release your sale check. When you bring in your thank you, you will receive the plaque/picture frame with you and your animal that you will be expected to deliver to your buyer and thank them in person (the plaque will no longer be given out at fair).

lead in service to tackle community challenges and



Attention Leaders!!!

A volunteer leader in their **5th YEAR** is required to complete a training that will benefit their role as a 4-H volunteer.


