Only enter 1 ingredient per ingredient line.


List ingredients in order of use in the ingredients list and directions.

Spider Web —Reflection and teamwork


Supplies Ball of yarn —Let's get started!

Form a circle with club members, volunteers, parents, etc. Have one person start by holding on to the end of the string. First the individual shares something about himself/ herself and then tosses the ball of yarn to someone across the circle. Then that person holds on to the part of string that reached him/her, shares something about himself/ herself and tosses the ball of yarn to the next person. When do we enter?



<u>Saturday—January 30th—9:00 to 3:00 p.m.</u>—Sewing Project will be "Ryan's Case for Smiles" pillowcases to donate to children hospitalized with cancer

<u>SEWING</u>—For the January pillowcase workshop, members will be making pillowcases. If they plan to make their pillowcase of one piece of fabric, they should bring 1 1/8 yard of cotton, prewashed. If they plan to make their pillowcase with a contrasting cuff, they will need 1/4 yard of fabric for the cuff, and another 7/8 yard of fabric for the body of the pillowcase (again, prewashed). Please bring matching thread as well. Ric-Rac and other trim will be provided. More experienced members who wish to make more than one pillowcase can bring additional fabric.



QUILTING—If you just want to come and sew and work on your own project that is fine. If you have a pattern for a quilt block or quilt bring it and we can figure out a time frame and if it is going to be to complicated. I know we have a few members who are making pillows out of blocks we made last year. If so, please bring your pillow form or stuffing you plan on using along with some batting and backing for the quilted piece and a backing for your pillow. If you are questioning what to bring give me a call and we can get you a project figured out. I really don't have any plans for you this year but if you need ideas I will have books to look through.

Also, a reminder that the February workshop is the first weekend in February (the 6th), not the 13th.

<u>Saturday—February 6th—9:00 to 3:00 p.m.</u>—Sewing Project will be making clothing for 18" dolls and for stuffed animals

For the February workshop on clothing for dolls and stuffed animals, students should bring the doll or stuffed animal that they wish to dress. They may bring scraps of fabric (including fat quarters) that they'd like to use for making clothing. They may also bring trim (lace, buttons, etc.). However, we will also provide trims and fabrics that the members may use as well.

If you plan on staying the entire workshop, please bring a sack lunch. If possible, please bring an adult to assist. Bring you quilting projects for assistance. There are sewing machines available to borrow. Please bring appropriate tools (scissor, seam ripper, etc.), materials for the project, including pre-washed fabrics, manual for their sewing machine, if possible.

When you think about teaching trustworthiness to others you must remember that is does not happen overnight. Instead it is something

overnight. Instead it is something you should model for others everyday—you influence and are a role model for everyone you come in contact with. Take time to discuss with others how trust is earned and why we consider others trustworthy. Provide specific examples and illustrations to express thoughts. For example: How do others earn your trust? How do you know when you can trust people? Which people do you feel are the most trustworthy?

Trustworthiness in 4-H: Six Feelings

Supplies: Seven large signs with one name on each of the Seven Dwarfs on each sign (Happy, Sneezy, Dopey, Grumpy, Sleepy and Doc). Post these signs on the wall.

Ask the participants to look at all the signs on the on the wall. Have club members and guests stand by the sign that best describes how they feel at that moment. Explain that is it ok to be honest about what and how they are feeling. Give each group about 10 minutes to create a 30 second commercial to show their emotion. Have each group act out their commercial.

Discussion Questions:

Do you think how you feel or act affects whether a person feels they can trust you or not? Why or why not?
