Members of Sheridan County 4-H competed in the state F.I.R.S.T. Lego League (FLL)

competition in Casper over the weekend. This was the first year that Sheridan County 4-H has sent a team to the competition. The team worked very hard to prepare for the competition and the results showed their hard work paid off. The Sheridan County team placed first in the presentation part of the Competition! The team consisted of 4-H members Fisher Burris, Cade Relaford, Cody Hope and Kyle Mediate.

The FLL competition is a science, technology, engineering and mathematics orientated competition that focuses on robotics. At this competition teams are judged in four different areas which are core values, a presentation, robot design, and how the robot the team designs completes a series of missions. Each year there is a theme for FLL and this year's theme was "World Class: Learning Unleased." Teams had to come up with a more innovative way of learning about a topic of their choosing. The 4 areas that the youth are judged on are based on this theme. The Sheridan County 4-H team chose to educate people on a more innovative way to learn who is on US paper money. Their presentation on this topic earned them the top award at the competition.

At the competition in Casper there were 62 teams that participated from across the state. Members on a team have to be in the age range of 9-14 and the teams that compete can have anywhere from three to ten members. The teams that participated come from a wide variety of organizations such as schools, afterschool programs and other groups such as 4-H.

The Sheridan County 4-H team would like to thank Vacutech, the Sheridan County 4-H Council and Eddie and Cheryl Relaford for sponsoring their team to go to the competition.

Character Counts Trustworthiness

Being trusted is among the highest achievements of individuals and



What does it mean to be Trustworthy?

People will trust a person who has a reputation of being You're trustworthy when: honest, reliable and responsible.

Dishonesty can easily tarnish that reputation, such that others consider you untrustworthy. Being considered trustworthy provides benefits from the way people deal with you, as well as your own self-esteem.

Trust in another people has several meanings:

- 1. Trust means that you feel that the person is honest and will not lie, cheat or steal from you.
- 2. It also means that you can count on the person to do as he or she promised and that the person is reliable.

Finally, trust in a person means that you feel he or she can be counted on to do something important, will not shirk from duties, and will take personal pride in what he or she does.

Trustworthiness in 4-H

4-H Club Activity

The "Gossip" Game

Have the group sit in a circle. Whisper a statement in one person's ear. You cannot repeat it even if they didn't understand it the first time. That person repeats the statement in the next person's ear, and so forth around the room. The last person

tells what they heard out loud.

Discuss what happened. Did the statement end up the same as it began? Was it close? Why or why not? How does this relate to "real life"? Why can gossip become so harmful?

Trustworthiness: in-

volves four major qualities:

- Integrity: the idea of a moral wholeness, or oneness, demonstrated by a consistency of thoughts, words, deeds, and duties.
- 2. Honesty: means that a person doesn't do things that are morally wrong. If something you do is breaking the law or you have to hide it because you'll get in trouble, you are probably not being honest.
- 3. Promise-keeping: A man is only as good as his word
- 4. Loyalty: standing with and behind someone in need. Loyal friends share both triumphs and trauma, and offer honest, constructive feedback delivered in a kind and tactful manner.
