Livestock Sale Meetings

Attendance of at least one meeting is **MANDATORY**! Failure to attend one of the meetings will result in an additional 10% commission to be added onto the per animal sale charge imposed to sell in the Junior Livestock Sale at Fair. If you attended the sale meeting in February, March, April or May you have already met your MANDATORY sale meeting requirement.

Additionally this year we are requiring all members who sell livestock to bring in a written thank you and stamped envelope to the extension office **within 30 days of the sale**, before we will release your sale check. When you bring in your thank you, you will receive the plaque/picture frame with you and your animal that you will be expected to deliver to your buyer and thank them in person (the plaque will no longer be given out at fair). 
The Sheridan Cowgirls Rodeo is looking for volunteers.







307 Livestock Judging Series Rules

- 1. Open to current Wyoming 4-H members that are in good standing.
- Contestants will be split into two divisions based on 4-H age: Senior (age 14+) and Junior (8-13).
- To be eligible for the series awards to be given out at State Fair, contestants must compete in 2 eligible contests through the summer, plus the State 4-H contest.
- Points will be awarded to the top 20 individuals within their respective division, in reverse order of placing.
 - a. Example: 1st place 20 points, 2nd 19 points, 3rd 18 points, etc.
 - b. If there are less than 20 contestants within the division at a contest, the top score will reflect the number of contestants. Ex: 15 contestants in division 1st 15 points, 2nd 14 points, etc.
- Rankings and award winners will be determined by only the best 2 placings at eligible summer contests, plus placing from the State 4-H contest.
 - a. If contestants attend more than 2 eligible contests during the summer, only the top 2 point totals will count. Ex: Contestant A places 3rd at Natrona, 14th at Park, and 10th at State Fair, while not attending any other contest. This contestant will have earned 18 points, 7 points, and 11 points respectively for a total of 36. Contestant B goes to 5 contests plus state fair, placing 4th, 7th, 12th, 18th, and 9th, with a 14th place finish at State Fair. Contestant B will get points for the 4th (17) and 7th (14), place finishes, plus the 7 points for the 14th place State Fair finish for a total of 38 points. Contestant B would be ranked higher at the end. It is beneficial to attend all the contests and be able to have a bad day.

6. In the event of a tie, it will be broken as follows:

- Average of reasons scores from contests where points are used for final rankings.
- b. Placing at the State 4-H Contest.
- There will be awards for the top 5 in both the Senior and Junior divisions.*
