





Prepare feed, milk the cow, get the milk stored and clean the equipment. TBA-Saturday Afternoon- Blue Yonder Farm: Rotate milk out of storage, learn what things could be made from it and how.

TBA – 6pm-8pm- *3401 Coffeen Ave. - Watt Ag. Center, Sheridan WY 82801* **Room 131:** We will make simple soft cheese and bring all the info together in a summary

TBA -Blue Yonder Farm: Calving time TBD by the cows.

August-Story Boards exhibit at the Fair

September 2016-August 2017- Will offer this beginner program and "Phase II-So you want to have a Homestead Cow but do you buy a calf, a heifer, or a cow already broke?"

Our sewing project should take 2-3 hours, so members are welcome to join us in the morning or in the afternoon. As always, we will have extra machines available for those members who may not have a machine for whatever reason. Members can bring other projects on which they are working, if they prefer. Also, any member intending to attend for the entire day should bring a sack lunch. We will break for lunch at noon and resume work at 12:30 pm.

As usual, quilting members should bring a project of their choosing and we will assist them.

This month, our sewists can choose to either sew a simple skirt, OR simple elastic-waist pants or shorts. Members who don't wish to sew a simple skirt should bring a pattern for simple, elastic-waist shorts or pants instead, with prewashed fabric and their notions (elastic, thread, scissors, ripper, machine).

For the simple skirt, members will need to bring:

Their sewing machine (and manual or someone who knows how to use the machine) Sewing scissors and/or thread scissors

Pins

Thread

1 inch wide non-roll waistband elastic (a package, or their waist length)

Seam ripper if they have one

(Ideally, an adult to assist your sewist as well)



We will be making a simple skirt with an elastic waist and a single seam and basic turned hem. So, they will also need to bring prewashed fabric and matching thread and a package of 1 inch elastic (3/4 inch will work if the store is out of 1 inch). To figure the amount of fabric that you'll need to make a skirt which ends right at your member's knee, measure from her waist to her knee. Add 4 inches to that [2 inches for the hem and waistband, and the other 2 inches are for shrinkage]. This skirt will work best made with medium-weight cotton, but if you find a lightweight denim or corduroy that you want to use instead, that will work too. Medium-weight cotton is quilting cotton (the easiest fabric to find here in Sheridan).

You can find fabric and notions at Ace/Ben Franklin's, the Quilter's Fix, or Wal-Mart (here in town). There's also the quilt shop in Story. The quilting shops are unlikely to have elastic, but would have everything else you need.
