

Attention Leaders!!!

All new leaders and leaders who are in their 5th year and need to be re-screened are now required to complete training requirements before they will be screened and approved as a 4-H volunteer leader.

A **<u>NEW</u>** leader is required to complete two training pieces; in any order:

- 1. The Volunteer e-Learning modules accessible from the State 4-H website.
 - <u>http://www.uwyo.edu/4-h/</u> The password is **volunteer**.
- 2. The face-to-face New Leader Orientation, which is completed by Liz.

A volunteer leader in their **5th YEAR** is required to complete a training that will benefit their role as a 4-H volunteer.

Try this for a fun game or ice breaker idea....

HUMAN BINGO

As each person arrives, he is given a sheet of paper divided into 25 squares (bingo card). Each person then attempts to get the remaining squares filled with signatures of other persons present.

After everyone has had sufficient time to fill their sheets, the sheets are used as in Bingo. The leader may use a master list of everyone present or may have each person introduce themselves. Players check off on their sheet each person as the name is mentioned and calls Bingo when he has checked off every person on a vertical, horizontal, or diagonal line. Winners may be awarded some humorous prize. Use a sheet of 16 squares for a small group.
