On April 8th a preview of pigs will take place from 1–2 pm at the Sheridan County Fairgrounds. Numbers will then be drawn for each pig.



ATTENTION ALL LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS:

Livestock Fitting Rule – All 4-H or FFA members must accompany, care for, groom, fit, and exhibit their own livestock at Sheridan County Fair. However, when needed, any bonafide Sheridan County 4H/FFA Member, parent, leader, or Advisor/Educator may assist with fitting, feeding, general care, and cleaning as long as the 4H/FFA member is present to help, learn, and interact. Assistance from a non-Sheridan County member will not be allowed or tolerated. *Violations of this rule must be reported to the Livestock Committee. Two warnings will be given and after that time the particular animal will be disqualified from showing in any classes it's entered in for the fair.*

Saturday, February 17th Fiber Arts Workshop:



Saturday, February 17th is this month's Fiber Arts workshop. Members in quilting, sewing, crochet, and knitting projects can attend for assistance with their project work.

Quilting members: Plan to quilt either in the morning or the afternoon; if you are a sewist, quilt when you won't be sewing.

Knitting members: Please RSVP to the 4-H Office by Wednesday, February 14th if you plan to attend. Our knitting leader will not be present unless there are RSVPs from members planning to attend.

Crochet members: Kandra will be in attendance to assist. Please bring your project, or bring your questions so Kandra can help you plan a project.

Sewists:

Our intermediate sewists will meet at 9am in room 131. Bring your pre-washed fabric and your pattern. You will cut out your pattern and begin sewing your project! So, you will also need to bring your machine, scissors, thread, notions, etc.

Our <u>beginning sewists</u> will meet at 1pm in room 131. We will be making either a simple skirt or elastic-waist pants (member chooses). If they want to make pants, they will need to find a pajama pant pattern and purchase the appropriate amount of fabric. If making a skirt, this is what they'll need to bring:

Their sewing machine and manual (if they have one, they can borrow if they don't) Sewing scissors and/or thread scissors Pins Seam ripper if they have one (Ideally, an adult to assist your member, as well). Prewashed fabric to make a skirt which ends at the member's knee; measure from waist to knee. Add four inches to that. Purchase 44" wide fabric in that length. Fabric should be 100% cotton. Matching thread

Package of 3/4 or 1 inch elastic

Members who will be at the workshop all day should plan to bring a lunch.

We will break for lunch at noon.

Interview:

Scholarship interviews will take place with the first 2 weeks of April at 6pm at the Extension Office. Be prepared to address questions about what you have gained from 4-H, your future plans, and why you think you would be a good representative for this scholarship, etc. Scholarship will be awarded at graduation.


