March 2018 Council Minutes

February minutes were read. Chris moved to accept the minutes as read, Donna seconded the motion. Motioned carried.

There was a continued discussion on what 4H paid the state on the meat sales the Junior Leaders did in December. There was a total of \$889 worth of meat sales, \$703.50 was paid to the state, leaving the Junior Leaders with a profit of \$186 in profit.

There was a total of \$1,327.45 worth of bills to be paid in carnival expenses. Susie moved to pay the bills as stated. Jennifer seconded the motion. Motion carried. Mellissa has the bill for the Facebook push that she will bring at the April meeting to be paid.

Critters Crafts and Cooking met during the carnival. Their next meeting will be the third Saturday of April.

Renegades held two carnival committee meetings and build their games for carnival. Their focus was to sell raffle tickets and promote carnival. Parents in the club are working on trip to Mile City in October to get a USDA stamp so the kids can do individual sales of products. They will be meeting the second Thursday of the month.

Shooting Sports will be holding Archery Safety meetings on April 1st and April 8th. If a member misses both of these meetings they will not be able to participate in archery this year. Practice will be from 1 to 3pm at the Exhibit Hall at the Fairgrounds.

Tongue River Round Up. They postponed their meeting this month. Will meet next on the Second Sunday of April.

Sheridan Livestock held their March meeting after decorating their carnival booth. They discussed what they would like to do differently next year. Next meeting will be Second Sunday of April.

Wyotana Grizzlies reported they had a great turn out of members at Carnival. They had supplied carnival with blue bags for kids to put their tokens and prizes in. There was 211 bags handed out during carnival. Their club has donated \$200 to the awards fund. Their next meeting they will be completing a Parli Pro example with Ice Cream.

It was mentioned that the Gathers have lost a lot of staffing and may not be able to be very active in 4H this year.

No Jr. Leader present to give report. Also their February Meeting was canceled.

The awards money is starting to come in. The account has roughly \$1500 in it so far. So far several of the donations have requested their money to go to a specific area.

Indoor Committee met before the council meeting. The application for Mini Showcase showdown is due April 6th, all guidelines are in the application. Showdown will be April 20, 21st. There is still a need for more help during showdown. Anyone interested should contact Donna. Volunteers are also needed to make cupcakes for the decorating completion. Expo has been moved from October 6th to October 13th.

Livestock reported that horse practice dates were added to the March Newsletter. Tagging will be May 19th from 8am to 11am. Quality Assurance Level 1 will be held March 28th at the college and April 15th in Tongue River. FFA advisors and Justin West are working on dates for the Level 2 and 3. The board is still working on dates for the mandatory sale meetings. The will be dates in April, May and June. The Wild West Jackpot will be held June 9th and 10th. Melissa questioned when the dates would be to get certified to jump in horse events at Fair. Those dates are May 8th and June 19th. Members must be present at both practices in order to jump.

Mountain Camp board reported that the Forrest service did not approve their plans for electrical updates at this time. The board is contacting an electrical Engineer and will make a new official proposal.






If you need help finding your market animal, please don't hesitate to call your Project Leader, Club Leader, or the Office!! We are all here to help!! **ATTENTION ALL LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS:**

Livestock Fitting Rule – All 4-H or FFA members must accompany, care for, groom, fit, and exhibit their own livestock at Sheridan County Fair. However, when needed, any bonafide Sheridan County 4H/FFA Member, parent, leader, or Advisor/Educator may assist with fitting, feeding, general care, and cleaning as long as the 4H/FFA member is present to help, learn, and interact. Assistance from a non-Sheridan County member will not be allowed or tolerated. Violations of this rule must be reported to the Livestock Committee. Two warnings will be given and after that time the particular animal will be disqualified from showing in any classes it's entered in for the fair.

Market and Breeding Meat Goat 2018 Fair Changes



1.) No goat superintendent—position is still open to anyone who would like to apply

2.) Market and market breeding goats will show at the Sheep Show on Saturday. Dairy goats will show on Saturday morning like in the past.

We are still working on how to schedule the overall showmanship and one idea was to have dairy kids show normal then winners of the class would also have to have their animals ready that afternoon for the market showmanship for overall showmanship—which then would keep the numbers high enough for buckles.



Our April Fiber Arts workshop is Saturday, April 28th. Crochet and Knitting members are asked to please RSVP so that we can ensure that your leaders are available to assist you.

Quilting members, please bring books, patterns, and/or fabrics which you are considering, so that you can discuss your plan of action. If you are ready to begin your project, please bring all the necessary tools as well (rotary mat, rotary cutter, etc.). If you will be ready to begin piecing, bring your machine and thread as well.

The Intermediate Sewists are asked to participate between 9 am and noon. Intermediate sewists will bring their pattern and their prewashed fabric, pins, sewing machine, etc. We will lay out and cut out your pattern, and begin sewing.

Intermediate Sewists are invited to join the Beginning Sewists if they wish during the afternoon, at 1pm, when we will be making pillowcases to donate to Ryan's Case for Smiles, which delivers them to children who are hospitalized with long-term illness, although members can keep their pillowcases if they'd prefer to do that. The actual project would take an hour or less (per pillowcase). Bring either 1 1/8 yard of prewashed cotton fabric, or 7/8 yard plus 1/4 yard contrasting fabric (prewashed), per pillowcase. There will be some extra fabric available for members. Please bring your machine, scissors, pins, thread to match your fabric, etc.

Members who will stay all day are asked to please bring a sack lunch to be eaten between noon and 1pm. If possible, please bring an adult to accompany the member (the adult does not need to be a knowledgeable sewist!).





Join us on January 22nd from 6:30 -7:30 pm via Zoom, in an online meeting, to learn more about how to welcome new members and families into your club or the 4-H experience in general. Also if you are a new or newer volunteer this might be a great way to learn more about the ins and outs of 4-H and how you can stay up to date on 4-H information and experiences.

Attention Leaders!!!

All new leaders and leaders who are in their 5th year and need to be re-screened are now required to complete training requirements before they will be screened and approved as a 4-H volunteer leader.

A **<u>NEW</u>** leader is required to complete two training pieces; in any order:

- 1. The Volunteer e-Learning modules accessible from the State 4-H website.
 - <u>http://www.uwyo.edu/4-h/</u> The password is volunteer.
- 2. The face-to-face New Leader Orientation, which is completed by 4-H Educator.

A volunteer leader in their **5th YEAR** is required to complete a training that will benefit their role as a 4-H volunteer.


