Sheridan County 4-H Council Meeting Minutes, May 14, 2018
(Donna Birkholz)

Kandra called the meeting to order. Dane led the pledges.

April minutes were read by Kandra. Jennifer Forsness moved that they approved as read, except that one of the “robotics” phrases about Showcase Showdown should be amended to read “Robotics and Rocketry.” Heidi Justus seconded, and the motion passed.

Barb read the treasurer’s report [I meant to get the exact numbers but didn’t, we will need to insert those.] Heidi Justus moved that we approve payment of the outstanding bills (867.44), Jennifer Forsness seconded, the motion passed.

Dane gave the Junior Leaders report. They outlined Mountain Camp at their most recent meeting, have some new workshops planned but mostly the same as in the past. They have a theme selected which Dane does not recall. He thinks it may be “Wild West.” Junior Leaders discussed the Fair Dance; had been asked to change its location; Kentz was unsure whether they could move it. Junior Leaders voted to instead hold the dance on Saturday evening after the pig wrestling, but still under the Grand Stands. They hope to use the same band as last year.

Kandra let everyone know that Ian Petzold had a big wreck last week but is OK and recuperating at home. Likewise, Jackie had a horse wreck; she’s still in the hospital but should be fine. On a related note, Kandra asked whether there would be interest in a first aid class for 4-H (adults and youth welcome). She will find out a cost and let us know, several in attendance were interested.

Club Roll Call:

Clubs not in attendance: Canyon Livestock; Critters, Crafts, & Cooking; Lucky 7; Gatherers; Shooting Sports

Big Horn Cowboys will meet Wednesday the 16th. They are trying to set up a service day on either the 4th or 5th of June at the Dog & Cat Shelter; cleaning pens, moving insulated dog houses, etc., with a BBQ afterwards. (Erin Hinton reported)

Renegades – canceled last week’s meeting due to Ian’s wreck. The first Friday of May, they went to Westview for a game night and icebreaker with the residents. Three members went back last Tuesday with a baby goat. That was about an hour and 20 minutes, very popular. They will go once a month as a group and then as individuals with projects. Their monthly work there will be mostly gardening etc. This month’s meeting will be rescheduled and will be a time to work on record books – section 1. In August, after State Fair, they will go back and update section 1; at the September meeting, review, finalize, and turn them in. (Melissa Petzold reported)

Kandra also let us know that she ran into a longtime 4-H supporter who described a fiber arts project, making towels into coverings for VOA assisted living residents and nursing homes – ribbon around the neck with a Velcro closure, and noted that there is a real need for 4-H members to visit the local homes.

Sheridan Livestock didn’t meet due to Mother’s Day.

Tongue River Roundup didn’t meet on Mother’s Day either. Their Highway cleanup is June 3rd, followed by a potluck at Heidi’s. Will continue working on record books at each meeting. They are encouraging members to help with the Ranchester cleanup. Also July 4th at the Ranchester fireworks, the mayor says clubs can set up booths with games to make money. (Barb reported)

Wyotana Grizzlies met on May first. They covered parts of the record book, explained the difference between projects and fair entries when filling out section 1; what community service is, the importance of leading the pledge and participation beyond 4-H being

recorded. Kandra suggests having older kids lead project meetings and note that as leadership. Wyotana's highway cleanup is Sunday, May 20th followed by a BBQ. No project tour this summer, and no more meetings until September.

Black Tooth Mustangs will meet Friday the 18th. They have lots of new kids and families and are working on the pledge and parliamentary procedure at the meeting. They have lots of rocketry kids so will work on those too.

[Interjected discussion about the fact that the rocketry dad, if interested, could host a workshop without becoming a leader, as long as a certified leader is there, and that workshops don't have to be regular monthly things, but instead could be a one-time event or whatever works for the volunteer.]

Went over Shooting Sports information a little – County Shoot is coming together; archery categories have been further divided to enable everyone to get time with the 3D target. Muzzle shooting began tonight.

Other board updates:

Awards – We have \$7,200 but need to bring more in so we have a cushion. We've only sent the letter out once, and need to send a second letter. More money will come in. We are still getting letters/money cared for. The Fairgrounds sends an immediate thank-you and the kids will send theirs after the Fair. The dog project wants bigger prizes for Reserve Champions, so Susie is going to find donations to cover that. Awards will need 50+ buckles, also coats. (Kandra reported)

Indoor Committee -- Asked for feedback on Mini-Showcase Showdown. The committee learned a lot, hosting this without an educator. We will ensure that all judge addresses are turned in next year, so that the office can follow up and we can ensure that judges know all the information (one fell through the cracks this year). Also a reminder to EVERYONE to empty kitchen trash if there's anything smelly in it after any event. (Donna reported)

Livestock Committee – Low attendance at the last meeting. Don't forget the tagging on the 19th. Quality Assurance on the 13th, all levels will probably be covered, also if members have missed the mandatory sale meeting, there is one left on June 13th. Horse clinics have begun. The Wild West jackpot information is available; it is June 8, 9, 10th. There are clinics – Swine on the 7th, 8am to 3pm; Beef 7:30am to 3:30 pm on the 8th; Sheep as well. RSVP to the office; there is a \$25 fee for the clinics. Heidi had checked and people can have more than one animal in a pen (there is a list of animals which would be approved for this).

Melissa Petzold asked if we could have Cori let club leaders know who has NOT gone to the mandatory sale and quality assurance meetings so we can follow up. Kandra will ask her to do that. (Kandra gave the livestock report)

Mountain Camp – Chris wasn't here. Kandra knows they are still working on the electrical system solution and the camp is in the black.

Mountain Camp food – Tammy was not in attendance.

Fair Food Committee – Tammy was not in attendance.

We paused and went through the Fair books for a few minutes. Cori needs any final updates/changes by May 18th. A few were noted during the meeting. A reminder to everyone to let members know about the Friday, July 27th judging for buymanship, all constructed sewn items, and fashion revue. Kandra noted a change in the book, the inclusion of a horned heifer pen. She has been approached about creating an Open show for beef; that needs to be discussed with Jamie.

Achievement Night – Kandra would like a committee to help plan things with the new Educator. After discussion we decided to bring this up at the June meeting.

Expo – Donna explained that Expo is now a subcommittee with Indoor committee, which will help but does need outside volunteers to

help with the workload. We will need to begin meeting in August and to have the Expo planning completed by the end of September. Erin Hinton, Heidi, and Cathy volunteered to be on the committee. Club leaders are asked to invite parents from their clubs to help. Chad will help with the leather group; Gwen Kepley might be able to help with the horticulture booth. We will try to set booths up so that parents or other adults covering multiple booths are next to all the booths they are assisting. Clubs will need to put together information about the club which will be displayed there.

Fair review – We discussed booth guidelines and booth decorating; Donna moved to table the booth discussion until the June meeting. The motion was seconded by Jody DeHaven, and passed. We will discuss whether to have a theme, and whether to have a prize for the best booth. Indoor committee will make a list of potential clerks at their June meeting and will report on judge/clerk status at the council meeting in June. Kandra will judge Cloverbuds again.

Heidi Justus and Melissa Petzold will be helping with Awards at fair – Heidi as “data girl,” and Melissa as the media contact person typing and sending summaries to the media. They will need to meet with Cori before the fair for a little training/planning. Kandra and Cori met to set up better record entry and think they are ready to go. Ribbons are ordered. We have blue ribbons which say “first premium” but we are going to use them up. Fun Day was discussed. It will be from 1-3pm on Sunday. Heidi Justus will help coordinate it. Kandra will bring a pit liner for a slip ‘n slide.

Farmer’s Market – begins June 21st. Donna moved that we finalize our dates via Cori before June 1st (first come, first served). Jennifer Forsness seconded. July 19th is the livestock sale promotion day, Renegades are hosting the booth that day. Donna Birkholz will coordinate the booth August 2nd. Each club will need to sign up for one day. Kandra will have a list of ideas for activities.

Mountain Camp – we need adults to attend. Tents are covered. There will be a food planning meeting. Make sure Kentz is informed about any allergies (remember that you can sign up as a day camper and bring your own food if you have allergies, too).

Cathy moved to adjourn the meeting, Melissa seconded the motion. Meeting adjourned at about 7:30pm.

Additionally this year we are requiring all members who sell livestock to bring in a written thank you and stamped envelope to the extension office **within 30 days of the sale**, before we will release your sale check. When you bring in your thank you, you will receive the plaque/picture frame with you and your animal that you will be expected to deliver to your buyer and thank them in person (the plaque will no longer be given out at fair).

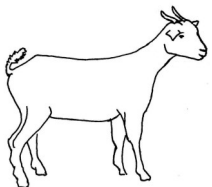


ATTENTION

ALL LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS:

Livestock Fitting Rule – All 4-H or FFA members must accompany, care for, groom, fit, and exhibit their own livestock at Sheridan County Fair. However, when needed, any bonafide Sheridan County 4H/FFA Member, parent, leader, or Advisor/Educator may assist with fitting, feeding, general care, and cleaning as long as the 4H/FFA member is present to help, learn, and interact. Assistance from a non-Sheridan County member will not be allowed or tolerated. *Violations of this rule must be reported to the Livestock Committee. Two warnings will be given and after that time the particular animal will be disqualified from showing in any classes it's entered in for the fair.*

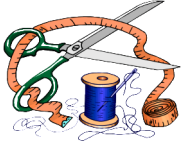
Market and Breeding Meat Goat 2018 Fair Changes
