- Growing tomatoes, onions, lettuce, spinach, carrots, peppers, brussels sprouts, zucchini, and squash.







No maximum show weight BUT- maximum Livestock Sale weight caps remain the same


Youth selling market animals must complete a YQA class level corresponding to their age divisions.
