



Describe how you are making a positive impact on your club, our communities, and our nation? Tell how your actions are benefiting others.

SECTION 6 STORY & QUESTIONS

Fully describe in paragraph form your 4-H experience this year. This gives you an opportunity to elaborate further on your experiences and how they affected your final project. Be sure to use complete sentences, proper punctuation, and corrrect spelling.

SECTION 8 OTHER ACTIVITIES

Describe other activities you've been involved with outside of 4-H. Example: sports, music, church, other youth organizations.

Mick Kaser Memorial Scholarship

Complete Packet due to the Sheridan County Extension Office by October 1, 2019 Incomplete or late scholarship packets will not be considered

Maximum Amount: Two Scholarships given at \$1000 each per year **Requirements**:

- ✓ Must be or have been a Wyoming 4-H member in Sheridan County
- ✓ Must be a graduating senior or equivalent for home schooled students or have graduated high school within the last two years.
- ✓ Must plan to attend a trade school, community college or university
- ✓ Must have participated in the Sheridan County Shooting Sports within the last two years of 4-H Eligibility

Please include:

- An essay on the impact that 4-H with an emphasis of shooting sports has made in your life and how what you have learned in 4-H that will help you succeed in the future
- o 1-4 pages double spaced, 1" margins, Times New Roman font-12pt.
- Hint: this should not solely focus on fairs, county shoot, or awards won, but an entire overview of your 4-H career
- ✓ Most recent high school transcript or equivalent
- ✓ Résumé
- ✓ Two letters of recommendation from someone not related to you. One from a leader in your 4-H Club, if there is a problem with this please call the office and we will help you with that, and another from a high school counselor, teachers, or boss, etc.

Interview:

You may be asked to interview with a committee of 4-H leaders. We will email you to set up a time. (Zoom interviews will be available if you are no longer in Sheridan.)

Selection:

If you are selected for the scholarship you will be awarded the scholarship upon your request. You must request the funds within two years of successfully receiving the scholarship.
