Hosting 4-H Meetings in Light of COVID-19

The health and safety of all 4-H members, volunteers, parents, guests, and staff is the top priority of the Wyoming 4-H Program. To help reduce the risks associated with the spread of COVID-19, the following guidelines from the Wyoming Department of Health and the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) should be followed to protect yourself and others.

- Stay home when sick and avoid contact with other people unless you need medical attention.
- Follow common-sense steps such as washing your hands often and well; covering your coughs and sneezes; and cleaning and disinfecting.
- If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people by staying at least 6 feet apart.
- Wear cloth face coverings in public settings where social distancing is difficult to maintain.

To help safeguard the health and safety of our members and volunteers, the following guidelines need to be followed for all 4-H meetings.

Before Your 4-H meeting:

- Ensure that no more than ____ people are in attendance. The number needs to include everyone (volunteers, parents, members, siblings, guest speakers, etc.)
- Inform all possible participants to stay home if they are experiencing any of the symptoms of COVID-19 or have had known contact with anyone with COVID-19 in the last 14 days.
- Inform all possible attendees to stay home if they are considered at high risk themselves or if they live or work with individuals at high risk. (age 65+, are immunocompromised, or have other health factors identified by the CDC that increase risk if being exposed)
- Create and prepare any signs or documents that will be used at the event communicating procedures like, checking in, information for parents, expected times, etc.
- Wipe down all common surfaces as recommended by the Center for Disease Control (CDC). Common surfaces include tables, counters, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, phones, keyboards, toilets, faucets, chairs, etc.

When everyone arrives:

- Have a “check-in” process in place and follow it - include providing hand-washing location, hand sanitizer, and directions for where to wait until activity starts to ensure practicing social distancing, etc.
- Take attendance. Be sure to write down the names of EVERYONE that attended and the date.

During the 4-H meeting:

- Maintain social distancing (6 feet) throughout the meeting or activity by households. You may need to be creative with different ice-breaker activities, roll-calls, etc.
- Ensure a protocol is in place and followed for use of any type of equipment. This may require planning of sanitizing equipment between uses. This is especially important for shared equipment like sewing machines, firearms, clippers, pencils, crayons, etc.

After the 4-H meeting:

- Have activities ready for individual youth to do while awaiting their pick-up. These could be handouts, games, etc, that don't involve contact with each other.
- Wipe down all common surfaces with a disinfectant as recommended by the Center for Disease Control (CDC). Common surfaces include tables, counters, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, phones, keyboards, toilets, faucets, chairs, etc.

Preparing facilities for a 4-H meeting:

- Ensure that the size of the room or facility is large enough to allow for the number of expected attendees and in accordance with current Health Orders and County guidelines, this includes space to allow for social distancing.
- Space tables, chairs, shooting points, etc. farther apart to ensure social distancing (at least 6ft. apart).
- Wipe down all common surfaces as recommended by the Center for Disease Control (CDC). Common surfaces include tables, counters, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, phones, keyboards, toilets, faucets, chairs, etc.

Should you have food at your meeting?

- At this time we recommend food or snacks not be provided as part of 4-H meetings. If you feel you need to provide food or snacks, please communicate with your 4-H educator on recommended safety protocols.

Summary

As a volunteer, your health and that of our youth members is of utmost importance and as such some engagement may be minimized at the request of a UW employee or UW 4-H Volunteer based on a health concerns associated with COVID-19.

By following the above best practices, we hope to offer more opportunities for youth to interact face-to-face within the parameters provided by your county health officials. If you have any questions, please contact your UW 4-H Educator for assistance or clarification.

Barb moved to approve, Melissa 2nd - APPROVED

Treasurer Report

The Treasurer's report was emailed out and copies reviewed during the meeting and will be included with the minutes. Melissa moved to approve, Jessie 2nd - APPROVED

Roll Call of Clubs:

Lucky 7 – Carnival went well, we had fun and the booth turned out well. Last community service for ERA Carroll Realty done, highway clean-up for the meeting place all year in person. 4H camp work will be cancelled due to road being washed out and full the date the club could go. No meetings for the rest of summer.

Jr Leaders – Working on Mountain Camp planning with Cora. Community service event, turned fundraiser at 1st Northern Bank - \$1100 and \$170 donations; goal is to be able to buy an animal this year at the livestock sale. Pig Pickin' coming on July 23rd.

Sheridan Livestock – Met Thurs 6/3 at the park, talked about carnival and jackpots. Plan to meet in July. Fundraiser 4th of July at Equestrian Center with cotton candy and kettle corn.

Renegades – Meeting for May was Carnival. June and July will meet at the fairgrounds, dates/times TBD on availability. Next formal meeting 9/21.

Wyotana – Highway clean up planned for 6/12/21. Carnival had 2 booths. Will help Jodi Edwards with a food booth at the polo fields 6/20/21. Will not meet June, July, August. Next meeting is 9/21.

TRR – Carnival fun this year, enjoyed it. Dead Swede Bike Race aid station on 6/5/21, very fun and kids like this community service event. Hwy clean up planned for 6/16/21 and BBQ at Justus' after, no meeting on 6/13/21.

Critters, Crafts and Cooking – Meeting at Carnival, Dumbo themed carnival game, won 1st in decorating contest. Meeting planned for 6/26 in the park with lunch and ice cream. Will try to meet in July, no meeting in August.

Bighorn Cowboys – May meeting was planning for carnival. Wednesday 6/9 highway cleanup, pizza and decide future meeting dates.

Old Business:

King Ropes Hats Fundraiser – All hats are sold and was a successful fundraiser for council. Can get more made in batch increments of 25. Heidi moved to buy 50 hats for selling at Pig Pickin' fundraiser 7/23/21 before fair, Erin 2nd – APPROVED

Discussion of more hats can be purchased to be sold at the livestock auction.

REMINDER TO ALL MEMBERS, LEADERS, PARENTS

4-H Carnival is a fundraiser for the SHERIDAN CO 4H COUNCIL, not for individual clubs. Raffle ticket sales are fundraising for clubs, so the more you sell the more your CLUB makes.

Carnival: Recap and discussion

Food:

- even \$ amounts for food
- make tickets at the beginning of food line, premade with food amounts and pay at the end

Date/time: Date proposed is 4/30/22 from 4-7 PM – Suzie to check on availability and report back at July meeting.

Profit: \$4403 total (tickets and food)

Keep Raffle separate from the Carnival – proposal for drawing in October during 4H week; leaders would like tickets available at beginning of September. Order 7500 tickets in August. Discussion of prizes, gift certificates to local businesses.

Raffle: Bailey moved to change raffle draw date the week of October 4H week, tickets can be picked up 1st week of September, baskets or donation of \$100 minimum from clubs, Melissa 2nd – APPROVED

Melissa amended the motion to include buying 7500 tickets for sale, Bailey 2nd – APPROVED

Tickets will be sold as follows: books of 10 tickets for \$20 or \$2/ticket

Members will be responsible for selling tickets they take or giving tickets back to the office by a deadline if not sold or be responsible for money turned in, and will need to CLEARLY communicate this expectation next year and date. Date TBD

Kettle Corn sales by Sheridan Livestock – miscommunication as thought this would be tickets, but cash was exchanged. Discussion of the carnival is a council fundraiser. with a \$458 profit, a family donated the \$150 in expenses. Barb moved to split the profits with Council and Sheridan Livestock, Suzie 2nd – APPROVED

Discussion – Cake walk is not a fundraiser for the club running the booth, this is a fundraiser for 4H COUNCIL, therefore cakes donated are going to the 4H COUNCIL fundraiser. Any club can run the cake walk, there was a proposal to have Jr Leaders and Cloverbuds team up to do this but may take some older members from other clubs.

Bring BINGO back – Unanimous YES – Council will run this and get volunteers

Flyers to schools – bring the flyer and get a free ticket – APPROVED

New Business:

Reminder to all leaders, project leaders, volunteers we cannot discriminate for any reason, including race, religion, sex and including COVID 19 vaccination status. 4H is a youth guided and youth directed program, we are here for youth.

Awards Committee: all buckles are ordered, \$19,000 in awards account. Now animal numbers can start ordering prizes.

Indoor Committee: Nancy Drummond is helping with the sewing workshops at the extension office, leaders are available for meetings. Scheduled until county fair. 4 new members coming. Crystal Mediate will help too when needed and Bailey is available to help.

Auditing books: Barb explained to council this is done monthly by the office staff and proposes that this suffices as the audit monthly as the bank statements come sealed to the office; Cori or Chandra can sign and file.

Awards need to have separate statements, brought to council for review as this is a subcommittee of 4H Council. Barb and Emily will meet to discuss and get information, Barb will plan to attach with the Treasurer's report for meetings.

Livestock Brittany Gorzalka

Tire Rama – paid \$1000 for past donations; in the past 2 parties have donated \$200 towards tires, Tire Rama \$800 - this is paid to the 4-H Council and then to be paid to Tire Rama. We have not paid x5 years, now we are making this right and will know the process going forward.

Storage for the Augra Culture Room at Ext office – donations of sleeping bags made ~25 and tents. Tents to be kept for mountain camp. Discussion 4H council not in need of sleeping bags. Heidi moved to sell sleeping bags and use money for shelving and totes for storage, Melissa 2nd – APPROVED – Cora will assist with selling.

Mountain Camp is planned for June 28-30, with Jr Leaders going up on 6/27. Leaders push to remind kids to sign up if interested. Registration is open 1 more week. More than 40 kids have signed up. Kandra and Vicky doing food prep and purchase. \$30/kid fee Leaders welcome to come or parents.

Horse Clinic and Show planned for 6/12-13 and judge coming from Roundup, MT. Total cost is approximately \$635 – donations received \$300 and plan to charge \$10/kid for the show to help with costs.
