The Meeting was called to order at 6:01pm by Chairman Justin West at the Extension Office on 9.7.22. Approval of the consent agenda:

- Secretary Amber Jensen took roll call.
- Approval of minutes from last meeting (sent out via email and included in the June newsletter)
- · Marci Timm's have the Treasurer's Report
 - Balance: \$500,966.38 as of 9/7/22
 - There is about \$85,056.68 left to collect from the sale.
 - Outstanding's (if any):

 - Justin asked for approval of the consent agenda. Kandra moved for approval of the consent. Stewart seconded. Motion passed.

Public Open Forum:

- The Floor was opened for 30 minutes for committee members and non-committee members to bring forward ideas for improvements to the fair. Superintendents were asked to please compile a list of grounds improvements for their species area and sent that to secretary Amber Jensen.
- Concern or suggest brought forward during the open forum:
 - Liz brought forward that it would be nice to have a way for kids to go see their weights during weigh-ins so they are not bugging the ladies at the scales or the office ladies. Some ideas for this was a TV hooked up in the show ring where they could go look. Or they are handed a slip after the walk across the scale.
 - Liz also wanted to thank Melissa Petzold for helping Stacy Jo log pictures at the back drop it was greatly appreciated. If Stacy Jo agrees to take pictures again next year we will need someone to help with this again.
 - Also looking forward to next year we need to communicated better with photographer if we will be moving a show inside, so she comes at a better time.
 - Next year we need a better way to track animals coming and going from the grounds if they are show and go, and animals that have choose to stay at the grounds all week.
 - For people showing out of the trailer we need to have a better designated parking for those trailers so they are not blocking people in or out of their stalls.
 - The committee would like to see some data on why we think we had 30 hogs not make weight this year at county fair.
 - Also, some date if kids were only aloud to sell 2 animals instead of 3 how many lots would that reduce in the sale?
 - Jessica Barnes asked that we look at getting some big tubs of water and ice to set at the
 end of bleachers during the sale so buyers do not have to stand in line to get a bottle of
 water they can just grab one.
 - The Enders Family asked for some clarification on how points are given for the heifer futurity when it comes to the live placing.
 - Cori asked to please be on the agenda for next meeting to talk about a producer's class.

The committee went into executive session at 7:12p.m. All no voting members were excused from the meeting.

Patti moved to adjourn the meeting and Jennifer 2nd the motion.
