YOUTH LIVESTOCK SALE REQUIREMENT Sheridan County Fair

Instead of doing in-person sale meetings this year we will be doing them virtually. Within that form is a video going over all the updates and reminders for the 2025 Sheridan County Junior Livestock Sale.

Please watch the WHOLE video to make sure you get all the important dates written down on your calendar.

Following the video, you will have a short quiz over everything you just watched (everyone should get a 100% because the video gives you the answers). If you do not pass with 8/9 points, Amber will reach out to you follow up that you understood everything in the video. If you have multiple members within a household they can watch the video together, but *each member* must complete a quiz to get credit for completing the requirement. *These must be submitted by 7/1/2025 by 5:00pm.* If this is not done by 7/1/2025 the following rule will be enforced.

1) Sale Commission and Hold Backs

A) The sale commission will be 10% of gross consignor sales of all animals sold in the sale (not to exceed \$1000 per consignor/exhibitor). Certain exclusions apply to this commission outlined in Section B Below:

B) If and only if a sale consignor completes the following items in BOTH section 1.B.1 and 1.B.2 the commission will be REBATED to the amounts outlined in section 1.C.

Rebate Exclusions:

1.B.1). Complete online Youth Market Livestock Sale training as a consigner with your guardian or parent. The link will be provided through the 4-H and FFA educators.

I.B.2). Completion of Section 5.A. and 5.B. below regarding delivery and proof of receipt of buyer thank you notes and plaques.

C) REBATED commission amounts are: (subject to meeting criteria in Section 1.B.1 and Section 1.B.2

Beef: \$120 per head Swine: \$50 per head Sheep: \$45 per head Coats/Poultry/Rabbits: \$35 per head/pen

The sale commissions will automatically be deducted from exhibitors checks before they are released.






















Sheridan County Livestock Committee Meeting 05.07.2025.
