SHOW-RITE

TIPS FOR BRACING



1. On the ground,
place your left leg into the lamb or goats chest and push against them. They should push back.

2. Keep head upright with ears up and forward.

Do not pull their head towards you in this process, that will drop their top and keep them from bracing.

3. If they're not pushing back,
place animal on the stand with front feet elevated. Push sheep or goat gently off the stand, and then catch them. If you do this once or twice, he/she should learn to push forward.

4. Start small.
Practice bracing daily. Ask them to brace for 15-30 seconds to start, and gradually work the duration to longer periods.

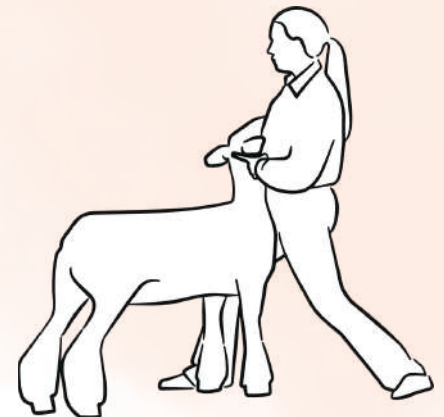
