RULES and GUIDELINES

- 1. The Heifer Futurity Program is open to all active 4-H and FFA members who reside in Sheridan County
- 2. Members must declare ownership for breeding beef no later than the June 1st deadline.
- 3. Completed record books (obtained online or at the extension office) will be due by July 20th to the Extension Office. The judges will need adequate time to judge them prior to the county fair. Record books must be handwritten in black ink or typed on a computer.
- 4. Age Requirements: Phase 1 heifer must born after January 1st of the previous year. Phase 2 cows **must** have completed Phase 1 the previous year and be shown with a calf at side.
- 5. A veterinarian will be present at county fair and will provide ultrasounds Saturday morning to confirm pregnancy in all Phase 1 and Phase 2 entries. Only bred entries will continue in the contest.
- 6. No contestant may enter more than two entries in each phase.
- 7. Loss of a calf in Phase 2 will not constitute disqualification. Grafting a calf is allowed. If a calf is lost, contact your Breeding Beef Superintendent.
- 8. Live placement will be held during the fair in the Heifer Futurity Show. A judges panel will be made up of appropriate local individuals in the breeding beef industry.
- 9. Interviews will be held the morning of Monday, August 7th. Members will be notified of the time, and place of the interviews.
- 10. Interview questions may be asked about feed costs, types, cost of grain, management techniques, goals, difficulties, vaccine/health, and any other areas of interest that the judges may wish to pursue.
