





- 2025 Fair Recap
 - Cat Show- we may need to tweak the timing with the pocket pet show. It was a bit noisy and chaotic getting cats checked in and making them wait for the whole pocket pet show.
 - o Dog Show- went well. No complaints.
 - Pocket Pets- Could we get a clip-on microphone for the kids next year? They need to speak during their show and the audience can't hear them. Hanna would also like to work with Sheridan Media to zoom in on each kid.
 - o Dairy Show- went well and Rachel didn't hear of any issues.
 - Swine Show- Chris didn't hear any complaints. Tony would like to change some times for weigh-ins but got good feedback from the one-day weigh ins.
 - Rabbit Show- it was a good show and the judge was well-liked. She will be put into the rotation.
 - Poultry Show- it went well. The leaders and members are thankful for the sale committee allowing them to sell more animals this year.
 - Sheep Show- The show went well. A few sheep got away from members. Lacey had a conflict regarding the buckle for the supreme ewe. This has been resolved.
 - Beef Show- the show ran smoothly. The ring size is too small and we may need to change the ring or how we line up in the ring. We also need to lay down shavings or turf for the entry so cattle don't get stone bruised. Heifer futurity winners will be announced at Achievement Day. Little Goose Ranch is providing the choice of a free heifer or \$1,000 cash.
 - Goat Show- it went well. Thank you Rindy and Lacey for helping run the ring. It was moved inside due to potential weather. Brittany will get with office staff to discuss futurity.

- Sale Committee- the sale went great. The smaller ring made it go faster and there was lots of great buyer feedback on this. Thank you Brittany and Larissa for doing a good job with the sale programs.
 - Larissa suggests having cards showing who is on the phone with bidders during the sale.
 It was difficult for people delivering consignment forms to find who was on the phone.
 - Hanna had buyers asking about add-ons. We do not currently do them. There is a group of buyers looking into a booster club type of model to purchase animals to donate to local business such as the HUB.
 - Larissa- if the booster club is formed, maybe they could help support the Fair to Fork program that is sponsored through our First Lady of Wyoming.
- Horse Show- Savannah was not present. Chris announced the show and said it went well.
 Brittany says she visited with Savannah and they felt the 3-day show was good because the kids weren't as tired. The dual purpose judge helped the show run more smoothly.
- Fairgrounds- Hanna states she and her son cleaned out the drain in the pig wash racks and it was a tough job. Would the fairgrounds be able to put a gate from the outside into the wash rack to help with this?
 - Justin- with the rain storms we have almost every year, the rain water comes off the roof of the sheep and pig barn and runs right inside. Can we get gutters put up?
- Rindy- the daycare tours went well and we hope to grow this in the future.
- Other New Business
 - The Extension Office would like feedback from superintendents on tagging forms. Would they like duplicates or triplicates from here forward? Office staff with discuss with each superintendent soon.
 - Awards, banners, buckles and ribbons- can we think of a new way to hand them out at fair during livestock shows? It is especially hard during the larger animal shows when the livestock spooks at the banners while the kids are leading them out. Will discuss further at a later date.
