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4-H Educator's Letter...

Spring is on its way and the 4-H season is really starting to rev up! Something to be getting on your minds this month is the Youth Quality Assurance classes (YQA)! Please remember if you show market livestock and are entering into a new age division in 4-H this year, or if you are taking a new species of market livestock for the first time, then you are required to attend a YQA class before fair this year. If you do not, then you will not be permitted to sell your market livestock in the Sweetwater Co. 4-H & FFA Livestock Sale.

All YQA classes will be held in April & May only this year. If for some reason you cannot make it to a YQA class on any of the available dates, don't stress out. I say this because any workshop/clinic/training that pertains to your market project, that you participate in counts as a YQA course taken. You simply have to provide proof of your participation to which ever workshop/clinic/training you were part of to the 4-H Office before July 11, 2019. If you have questions about what may or may not count as a workshop, clinic, or training, then don't hesitate to give the 4-H Office a call to get clarification or even some upcoming options that would count!

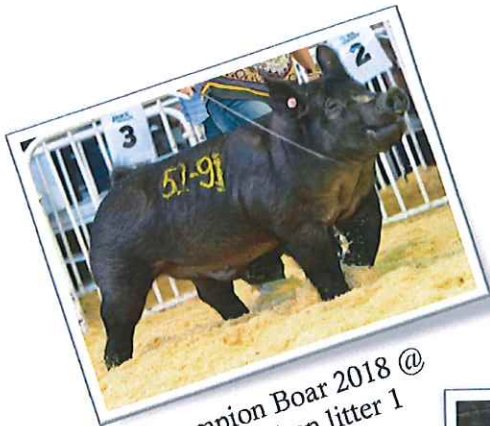

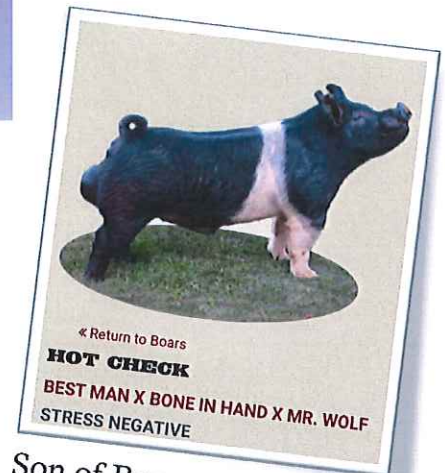

He attended and judged livestock at Coffeyville Community College where he was named a Junior College All-American. Caleb transferred to Texas A&M University where he judged on the 2011 reserve national champion team while receiving his B.S. in Agribusiness.

He then served as a graduate coach at Texas A&M, including coaching the 2013 national champion team, while earning an M.S. in ruminant nutrition. He has judged shows of all species at the local, state and national level in 16 states.

Changes for 2019 Horse Camp

- Camp is limited to the first 50 youth with registration fees paid. Youth and volunteers can register and pay fees by going to:

- Lodging will not be provided for campers. They will need to make their own housing arrangements.
 - The two lunches (Monday and Tuesday) and breakfast (Tuesday) will be the only meal provided for participants, Monday's breakfast and dinners will be on their own.

Camp Logistics

When: June 10-11, 2019

Where: Hot Springs County Fairgrounds in Thermopolis, Wyoming

Cost: \$60 (includes 3 meals, breaks, workshop supplies and t-shirts) horse stalls are additional

Registration deadline: May 24, 2019

Check-in times for youth: Sunday Night between 5:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. or Monday morning between 7:00 a.m. and 8:30 a.m. If you need to arrive during a time that the office is not open, please give Dawn a call on her cell phone and she will come down and meet you, (307) 799-8780.

Start time: Camp will start at 9:00 a.m. - on Monday with a skills assessment, which will be used to decide group placement for the rest of the camp. Check-in at the Fair Building on the Fairgrounds, this is where you will receive your stall assignment and registration packet.

End time: Horse camp will end at 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday

Registration Note** - This is a full two-day camp. Youth can not register for one day only.

Meals

Lunch will be provided on Monday and Tuesday, breakfast on Tuesday and snacks during break times. No breakfast on Monday morning or dinner either night will be provided this year.

Stalls

Youth will need to reserve a stall for each horse they are bringing. Stalls are \$20 per night and reserved when the youth registers for camp. If they are wanting a tack stall they are the same cost, \$20 per night and reserved when the youth registers for camp.

Shavings

Youth will need to bring their own shavings to camp, they are not provided and will not be available to purchase on site. You can purchase them from Thermopolis Hardware.



Lodging

Lodging will not be provided for campers this year. They are responsible for making their own sleeping arrangements and providing their own chaperones.

Fairgrounds Camping

Participants can park campers and horse trailers on the fairgrounds for free, but there are no services provided, this includes no electricity and no showers. Participants are welcome to bring a generator and use for electricity.

Health Inspections/Brand Inspections for Horses

All horses will need a health inspection that has been issued within the last 30 days. This will be checked at the registration table. Also, per Wyoming State Law, all horses being transported across county lines will need a brand inspection.

Tack and Equipment

- Campers should have equipment that fits and is in good repair. There is not a dress code, but it is suggested that campers wear appropriate clothing including boots, long pants, and a hat or helmet.
- Youth will need to bring all their own feed, feeding and stall cleaning equipment and sawdust for your stalls.



Additional Tips

- Please bring plenty of sun screen and a water bottle, as you will spend time out in the sun.
- Parents please have your child's medical information up-to-date in 4-H online enrollment program. We will use that as a treatment guide for any illness.

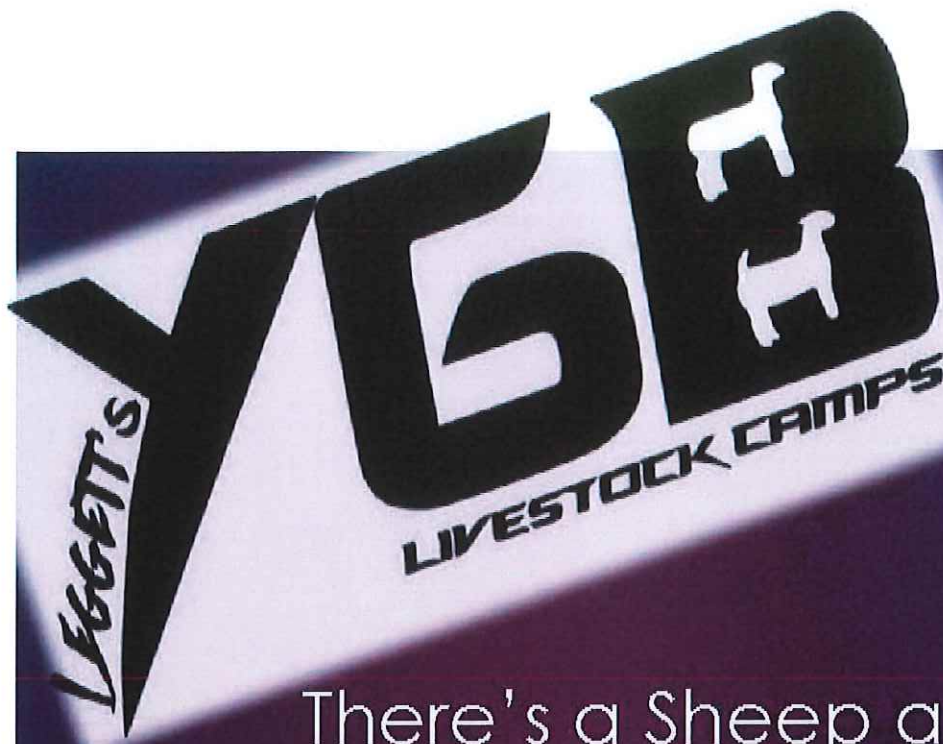
Volunteer Camp Instructors

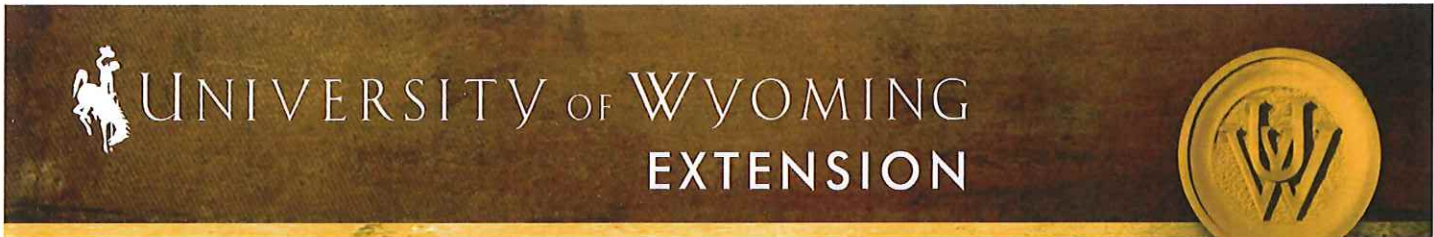
