## WYOMING ACHIEVEMENT PROGRAM AND 4-H HONORS CLUB



#### **ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS**

In addition to awards for competitions, participation recognition, or project ribbons at the county or state fair, Wyoming 4-H has an annual recognition of youth based on the extent of their 4-H involvement during the entire 4-H program year. Each year youth can be recognized a Green, Silver or Gold member at the county level and receive a medallion sticker to add to their 4-H Certificate of Achievement.

#### TO ACHIEVE GREEN

- o The member has turned in all the required enrollment materials
- has behaved in an appropriate manner at all 4-H activities, events, and meetings
- o is enrolled in at least one project
- o and is enrolled in at least one club
- Green members do not earn any achievement points towards the Honors Club

#### TO ACHIEVE SILVER

- The Member meets criteria for Green, AND...
  - The Member has exhibited what they have learned at some point during the current 4-H year with others.
  - Member provides documentation of setting goals, knowledge/skills gained, and participation in a project via the 4-H Record book
- o Silver members earn one point for the Honors Club

#### TO ACHIEVE GOLD

- o Member meets criteria for Silver, AND...
  - Member provides documentation in all essential elements of positive youth development via the 4-H Record book
- Gold members earn three points for the Honors Club

#### HONORS CLUB

The ultimate achievement that a 4-H member can obtain is inclusion in the Wyoming 4-H Honors Club. It is based on the principle of recognition for youth that maximize their opportunities to foster the elements of positive youth development which are belonging, independence, generosity, and mastery over multiple years of engagement. Nineteen (19) points must be accumulated from annual recognition points earned. Honor's club inductees are given special recognition that includes an exclusive UW Cowboy Clover tie/lapel pin or necklace/bracelet charm, and a \$500 travel scholarship.

The travel scholarship can be used towards the international trips, National 4-H Congress in Atlanta, National 4-H Conference, Citizenship Washington Focus or Leadership Washington Focus in Washington DC, Western National Roundup in Denver, awards trips for the various judging programs or Fabric and Fashion awards trips.

## Butternut Squash Mac & Cheese

Mac and cheese is the ultimate comfort food. Give it a healthy twist by adding butternut squash to the sauce!



#### **Ingredients**

- 16 ounces dry macaroni, shells, or other small pasta
- 2 Tablespoons margarine, butter, or oil
- 2 Tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 1 cup pureed butternut squash (10 ounces frozen butternut squash heated and pureed)
- 1 cup low-sodium broth
- 1 Tablespoon minced garlic (1 teaspoon garlic powder)
- Black pepper to taste
- 1 cup low-fat milk
- 1½ cups low-fat shredded cheese

#### **Directions**

- 1. Cook pasta according to package instructions. Drain and set aside.
- 2. If butternut squash is not cooked and pureed, cook it until tender, then puree in a blender or mash with a fork until smooth.
- 3. In a large skillet, electric skillet, or saucepan, melt margarine or butter, or add oil on medium high heat.
- 4. Once heated, add flour. Stir until combined and flour begins to brown, about 2 minutes.
- 5. Add butternut squash, broth, garlic, and black pepper. Stir until combined and heated through.
- 6. Lower heat to medium. Add milk. Heat, whisking constantly, until combined and warm.
- 7. Add cheese and stir until cheese is melted.
- 8. Add cooked pasta to the sauce and stir until pasta is completely coated and heated through.

# **Cloverbud Activity April 2023**

#### **Create your own Lego Craft**

(From the Ohio State Extension Office Website)

"In 1949, Danish carpenter Ole Christiansen created a set of interlocking red and white blocks, the first of what would go on to become Legos. It wasn't until 1958 that the Lego\* Company (its name derived from the Danish words for 'play well') patented the small bricks. The genius was in the simplicity of the unassuming blocks, which allowed children to create freely without limits and in nearly endless combinations. (Just six blocks could be combined in 102,981,500 different ways".) Allie Townsend, Time Magazine, 2011.

More than 400 billion Legos have been produced since 1949, which means there are 62 Legos for every one of earth's inhabitants. "What will you do with your 62 blocks?"

#### Here are a few ideas:

- Create a car. It can be as simple or fancy as you want. Did the design come to you as you were building or did you know what you wanted from the very start?
- Create a maze. Make a confusing set of pathways of our Legos and then use a minifigure to find its way through the maze.
- 3) Create your favorite Olympic moment or sport out of Legos.
- 4) Create a mixed media object. Mix your Legos with any of the following items and see what you can come up with. Here are some items to get your creative juices flowing: beads, cardboard, fabric, glue, marbles, plastic, rocks, ice, gems, paper, or wire. Now add some ideas of your own.
- 5) Create a shadow. Build something that you think will create a great shadow. Now take your creation to a sunny spot, inside or outside on a sunny day. Look at the shadow it casts. Move it around until it makes a shadow you like best. Look at the shadow on the ground compared to on the texture of a trunk of a tree. Take a picture of the shadow only.
- 6) Create a creature. A creature is a living organism. It can be a bug, a bird, an animal, a plant, or even something out-of-this-world. Then tell your friends about its habitat... where it lives, what it eats, etc.
- 7) Create a tool. When you are done, tell others what the tool is and what it will be used for.
- Create the tallest tower. This structure must be able to stand alone without anyone supporting it. Measure
  it and share how tall it is.
- 9) Create a flag. Tell about why you chose this flag, what the colors mean, and where it flies.
- 10) Create spring. Spring is the transition between winter and summer. What does spring mean to you? Create something that reminds you of spring and tell your friends about it.


