Quality Assurance Sweetwater County

All trainings must be completed & certificates turned into the office by July 15th

All 4-H members who plan on selling any market animal at the 4-H Livestock
Sale during the fair are required to take Quality Assurance Classes. Quality
Assurance training is for NEW members, members switching species, or
members moving up an age division. Class topics cover areas of appropriate care
and handling of animals and how this impacts product quality.

You can choose to take an instructor led training or the online training. The level will be determined by your 4-H age and division (Jr., Intermediate, Sr.)

Youth will watch a video and complete the corresponding test. You have to complete the whole training including the pretest and post-test for it to be marked complete. Please indicate you are in Sweetwater County when you sign up.

WHAT TO EXPECT:

- Lessons can be done online or in-person
- Each member participating will pay a \$12 fee for the online training or a \$3 fee for an instructor-led training and payment will be made online on the YQCA website.
- A family with multiple youth members can create a household account and add each member individually OR a member 13 and older can create their own account but cannot add anyone else to it.
- Plan for an hour to complete all three sections and quizzes.
- Members must pass all three sections and quizzes with an 80% or higher in order to receive their certification.
- Once members pass and complete the lesson, you will receive a certification of completion for that level of YQCA and share it with the 4-H Office.

- Intermediates can test out for \$36 but will need to retest out when they are in the senior division and seniors can test out for \$48.







Vegetable Pasta with Creamy Sauce

Crisp vegetables combined with a simple creamy sauce make this pasta dish delicious and vibrant.

Course: **Lunch & Dinner, Main Course** Cuisine: **American** Keyword: **dairy, grain, pasta, vegetable** Servings: **2**

Ingredients

- 2 cups uncooked pasta any kind
- 3-4 cups vegetables, fresh, canned, or frozen and thawed bell peppers, broccoli, mixed vegetables, peas, tomatoes, carrots, cauliflower, zucchini, etc.
- 2 Tablespoons flour
- 2 Tablespoons butter, tub margarine, or canola oil
- 2 cups milk
- ½-1 teaspoon garlic powder, dried basil, Italian seasoning, or other seasoning
- ½ teaspoon black pepper
- ½ cup grated cheese Parmesan, mozzarella, cheddar, etc.


Instructions

- 1. Wash hands with warm, soapy water for 20 seconds.
- 2. Cook pasta according to package directions. Drain.
- 3. While pasta is cooking, wash and cut vegetables into bite-sized pieces.
- 4. Steam vegetables until crisp tender, about 5 minutes.
- 5. In a saucepan or electric skillet, heat butter, margarine, or oil. Once butter or margarine is melted, add flour and cook until a paste forms and it browns slightly.
- 6. Add milk in a little at a time and whisk constantly until thick. If clumps form, use a spoon to break them up.
- 7. Add garlic powder or seasonings and pepper to the sauce.
- 8. Remove from heat and stir in cheese. Pour over pasta.
- 9. Add vegetables and stir.

2025 "Every Kid Outdoors" Program Guidelines

As a complement to the federal program, Wyo Parks will honor the 2025 "Every Kid Outdoors" passes through August 31, 2025. Passes are good for free entrance/day use at any Wyoming state parks, historic sites, or recreation areas.

How to use the 'Every Kid Outdoors' pass at Wyo Parks locations:

When visiting a park or site, simply show the pass to staff at a fee booth or visitor center. At unmanned sites, please display the pass in the driver's side of vehicle dashboard.

OFFICIAL RULES:

Any U.S. 4th grade student (or home-school equivalent) may use their "Every Kid Outdoors" pass for free admission to all Wyoming state parks, historic sites, and recreation areas.

• Passes accepted only when the 4th grade passholder is present.

Passes are good for free entrance/daily use fees, but do not cover additional fees such as camping, amenities, rentals, etc. Passes cannot be applied toward campsite reservations.

Historic Sites: free entrance for all children and up to three adults for free.

State Parks and Recreation Areas: free entrance/daily use for one vehicle.

• For visitors to any parks or sites travelling on foot, horseback or bicycle, the pass admits all children and up to three adults.

All passes expire after August 31, 2025.
